

2.1.1.2. Service Rules (5) [5]

The Service Rules are published on the official website of the university, www.iudehradun.edu.in (https://hr.iudehradun.edu.in)

The Employees are governed by the rules of The ICFAI University, Dehradun. The University offers them coveted conditions of employment along with social security benefits and leaves as per UGC guidelines. Apart from that, The University also provides Ex-gratia benefit (payment) to its employees in case of their untimely demise (policy annexed). Some of such benefits and leaves are as follows:-

The Employees are eligible for Leaves and other Benefits such as LTA and Medical reimbursement subject to the terms & conditions laid out in Employees' service rules and the latest/amendment Circulars issued from time to time.

- Leaves
- Maternity Leave
- Holidays
- Medical Reimbursement
- Leave Travel Allowance (LTA)
- PF
- ESI
- Gratuity

Leaves:

- 1. **Applicability and Scope:** The modified leave rules are applicable to all the employees on rolls.
- 2. **Effective Date:** The modified leave rules will be applicable with effect from January 01, 2013.

3. Leave Entitlement:

- a) During the period of probation, the employees are entitled to only Casual Leave @ 1 day for every month of completed service.
- b) On successful completion of the period of probation, employees are entitled to leaves as indicated below:

Encashable Earned Leaves (EEL)	15 Days

Sick Leaves	20 Days on half pay

- 4. **Date of crediting of the leaves:** Leaves will be credited on a calendar year basis (January 01 to December 31) as detailed below
 - a) Casual Leave will be credited @ 1 day per month of completed service
 - b) Earned leave: Earned Leaves (EELs & NEELs) will be credited to the account of employees @ 7½ days each of completed service on the 1st day of July and 1st day of January every year.
 - c) Sick Leave: Sick Leave will be credited to the account of employees @ 5 days on full pay or 10 days at half pay of completed service on the 1st day of July and 1st day of January every year.
- 5. Except Encashable Earned Leave balances, no other leave balances are encashable
- 6. Accumulation of Leave:
 - a) Unavailed casual leaves as on December 31, will not be carried forward to the next calendar year.
 - b) The unavailed Non-Encashable Earned Leaves and Encashable Earned Leaves taken together can be accumulated up to 180 days.
 - c) The unavailed sick leaves can be accumulated up to 60 days.

Conditions for Availing Leaves:

Every employee availing of leave(s) has to obtain the sanction of the competent authority by applying in the prescribed form.

Every employee desirous of availing of earned leave shall apply for it at least 10 days in advance.

- No employee shall be granted/sanctioned earned leave at one time for more than 120 days.
- EL can be availed in not more than three spells in a calendar period.
- Intervening holidays occurring during the EL spell will be treated as on leave and will accordingly be reduced from the leave balance of the employee.

• Prefix or suffix holidays shall not be counted for the purpose of calculating number of days on EL.

Unless warranted by extra-ordinary circumstances, no employee shall be granted more than seven days of casual leave during one spell. The employees will not be permitted to be absent on casual leave for more than 10 days together with holidays.

Casual leave cannot be combined with any other kind of leave. Casual leave can be availed for half a day also.

Every employee shall be entitled Sick leave(s) on medical grounds accompanied with a medical certification issued by the doctor.

Fifteen days or more than 15 days of the month in which an employee joined shall be treated as a full month for the purpose of calculation of the leave credit. The credit of leaves shall be reduced proportionately for every 15 days of absence due to extra-ordinary leave, consultancy leave, and Loss of Pay availed of in any particular half-year.

Maternity Leave:

- i) A female employee who has been confirmed and is on the time pay scale with no children or less than two surviving children may be granted maternity leave for a maximum period of three months i.e. 6 weeks prior to the delivery and 6 weeks after delivery.
- ii) Maternity leave not exceeding 45 days may also be granted to a female employee who has been confirmed and who is on the time pay scale (irrespective of the number of surviving children) during the entire period of service in case of miscarriage including abortion on the production of a medical certificate.
- iii) Maternity leave may be combined with leave of any kind except CL.

Holidays:

Holiday Leave provides employees with authorized paid absence from work for the purpose of observing designated holidays. All employees may be granted holidays with wages on three national holidays viz, Republic Day, Independence Day and Gandhi Jayanthi and other festivals of general and local importance. The total number of Holidays, including the three days indicated above, to be observed during the calendar year shall be decided and notified by the Management. Employees who cannot be spared on these holidays shall be granted a compensatory holiday with wages on an alternative day or given an additional day's wages in lieu whichever the employee may prefer. The specific dates on which the holidays will be observed shall be published every year.

Medical Reimbursement:

Only confirmed employees who are on Corporate Pay are covered under the scheme for extension of Medical reimbursement benefits, the same is included in monthly pay proportionately at the rate of one Basic per annum.

Leave Travel Allowance (LTA):

Only confirmed employees who are on Corporate Pay are covered under the scheme for extension of LTA benefits, the same is included in monthly pay proportionately at the rate of one Basic for two years.

Social Security:

Contributory Provident Fund (CPF)

As per the provisions of the Employees Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 the statutory minimum contributions are as follows:

"Employee's contribution towards Provident Fund is @12% on Basic Pay and DA, subject to maximum of Rs.6500/-. For employees whose Basic and DA exceeds this limit, the deduction towards contribution will be limited to Rs.780/- per month (i.e., 12% of Rs.6500/-)"

E.S.I

Applicability of the Employee State Insurance Act, wherever enforced by the Government Authority, employees drawing Gross salary upto Rs.15,000/-per month shall be covered under E.S.I Scheme as per Rules & Regulations.

Gratuity

All employees who are on the time pay scale of the organization and have been in continuous service for five years and above shall be eligible for Gratuity as per the provisions of The Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972.

Ex-gratia payment to the dependent family members of the deceased employees

There have been requests from some Departments to have a scheme whereby an employee's family is given some financial relief in case of an untimely demise of the employee while in service. This is more so in case of field employees.

As a good will gesture and to keep the system objective, it is decided to extend some financial help to the families of the employees who die during the service. The quantum of financial help is kept relatively low, considering that this is not a Life Insurance scheme. For this purpose, employees are classified into 5 categories based on annual CTC (excluding incentive payments, if any). The amount of financial relief proposed to be granted to the family of the deceased employee is given below:

However, employees who have put in less than 3 months of service may be considered eligible for 50% of the financial relief indicated above.

Under the proposed scheme, the financial relief will be paid to the nominees in case of the death of the employee due to any cause except the following:

- 1. Suicide.
- 2. Self infected injury: intentional self-inflicted injury.
- 3. Drug abuse: Alcohol or solvent abuse, or the taking of drugs except under the direction of a registered medical practitioner.
- 4. War and civil commotion: war, invasion, hostilities (whether, war is declared or not), civil war, rebellion, revolution or taking part in a riot or civil commotion.
- 5. Breach of law.
- 6. Criminal acts: taking part in any criminal acts.
- 7. Aviation: taking part in any flying activity, other than a passenger in a commercially licensed aircraft.
- 8. Hazardous sports and pastimes: taking part or practicing for any hazardous hobby, pursuit or any race not previously declared to and accepted by the insurance company.
- 9. Venereal disease, AIDS.

Procedure for payment:

- 1. In the event of death of the employee during the service, the concerned Head of the Department will forward to the Registrar with his recommendation for the payment of financial relief along with the following documents:
 - Original Death Certificate
 - Certified copy of the attending Doctor's certificate
- 2. The amount of financial relief will be determined and paid to the nominee of the deceased employee by cheque.

2.1.1.3. Policies (5) [5]

The employment policies of ICFAI Business School (IBS) are well defined in the service rules of the university. All academic and administrative staff is given the copy of service rules ensuring that they are aware of all dimensions of their employment.

Academic policies of IBS are defined in detail in the Student Handbook which is given to all students at the time of admission. Student Handbook is also made available to the faculties in pursuance of the implementation of academic rules. Cover Page of Student Handbook for the class of 2020 is attached.

2.1.3.3. Leader and Faculty selection process (5) [5]

Appointment and powers of the Chancellor:

The Chancellor shall be appointed by the Sponsor with the prior approval of the Visitor. The term of the office of the Chancellor shall be five years, and he may be reappointed for a second term at the pleasure of the Sponsor with the approval of the visitor.

The Chancellor shall be the Chairman of the Board of governors and the Head of the University. The Chancellor shall preside over the Convocation of the University, when the visitor is not present.

The Chancellor shall have the following powers:

- (i) To call for any Information on record.
- (ii) To appoint the Vice Chancellor.
- (iii) To remove the Vice Chancellor under Section 14(7) of the Act.
- (iv) Such other powers as may be delegated to him by the Board of Governors.

If in the opinion of the Sponsor, the actions of the Chancellor are found to be in any way detrimental to the interests of the University, the Sponsor shall appoint such other person as may be found appropriate in the position of Chancellor to succeed the person so acting after proper enquiry. Provided that, the Sponsor shall seek the prior approval of the Visitor before appointing such other person as the Chancellor. The Sponsor may stipulate the date from which such other person shall assume the office of the Chancellor.

The General Body (ICFAI, Hyderabad) may from time to time decide on the honorarium and /or the pay and/or allowances to be paid to Chancellor and/or perquisites to be provided to the Chancellor. The office of the Chancellor may be located anywhere in India or overseas.

Appointment, powers and responsibilities of the Vice-Chancellor

The vice-Chancellor shall be appointed by the Chancellor from the panel of three recommended by the Committee constituted in accordance with the provisions of Section 14(2) of the Act to be considered by the committee, each person must:

- (i) Hold a Ph.D., qualification in any of the disciplines.
- (ii) Have a post –qualification experience of at least 10 years;
- (iii) Be an accomplished academician or educational administrator or professional from industry, business and research, with a track record of at least 10 years in teaching,

training, consulting and has published research papers in reputed journals and other publications in the disciplines specified in Section 8(1) (a) of the Act.

If the Chancellor does not approve any of the persons so recommended, he shall record the resons there of and call for fresh recommendations,

Not with standing the above, the first Vice-Chancellor may be appointed by the Chancellor in a manner he deems fit.

The term of office of the Vice-Chancellor shall initially be Three years, and he may be reappointed for a second term by the Chancellor.

The vice-Chancellor shall be the principal executive and academic officer of the University and also the ex-officio member of the Board of Governors, Board of Management, Academic Council, Finance Committee and other Committees that may be set up by the Board of Governers or the Board of Management from time to time.

The Vice-Chancellor shall exercise general superintendence and control over the affairs of the University and shall execute the decisions of the various authorities of the university, and shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be prescribed by the Act and the Statutes.

In the absence of chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor shall undertake all the functions of the Chancellor and preside over the Convocation.

Where any matter other than the appointment of a teacher is of urgent nature requiring immediate action and the same could not immediately be dealt with by any officer or the authority or other body of the University empowered by or under this Act to deal with it, the Vice-Chancellor may take such action as he may deem fit with the prior approval of the Chancellor.

If at any time upon representation being made or otherwise, and after makingh such enquiries as may be deemed necessary, the Chancellor by an order in writing stating the reasons therein, may ask the Vice-Chancellor to relinquish his office from such date as may be specified in the order.

Appointment, powers and responsibilities Of the Registrar;

The Registrar shall be appointed by the Chancellor, based on the recommendation of the Selection Committee appointed for the purpose.

The Selection Committee shall consist of the following members;

- (i) One representive of the Chancellor.
- (ii) One representive of the Sponsor who is also a member of the Board of Governors.
- (iii) One expert Nominated by the Board of Management, who is not in any way connected with the University.

The Committees so appointed shall exercise their powers and functions within the delegated authority. Neither the university nor the Board of Governors, nor the Board of Management shall be accountable for the authority or powers used outside the scope of delegation by such committees.

Such committee shall be automatically dissolved on completion of their tenure or after completion of the tasks assigned to them by the authority appointing them, unless extension in the tenure is granted by the said authority.

Advisory Committees:

The Board of Management may, with the concurrence of the Chancellor, appoint an Advisory Committee consisting of five members for the purpose of providing advice to Board of Management in matters relating to the conduct of various affairs of the University.

The Board of Management may direct the Academic Council, Finance Committee and /or any other committee set up under the Act or these Statutes, to appoint and /or follow the recommendations of the Advisory Board.

The Board of Management may define the functions, and powers while establishing such committees.

Procedure for appointment of Faculty member:

The Board of Management may appoint Faculty Members on obtaining the information relating to vacancies from the Heads of the various faculties, based on the recommendation of the Selection Committee. The Board shall appoint a selection committiee to recommend name of the person to the post of Professors, Associate Professors, Assistant Professor and such other academic posts as may be prescribed by the Board of Management.

The Selection Committee so appointed shall consist of:

- (i) Two experts in the relevant disciplines nominated by the Vice-Chancellor.
- (ii) One nominee of the Board of Management not connected with the University and not below the rank of a Professor.
- (iii) Dean of the faculty.
- (iv) Head of the concerned Department/Allied Department.

The Board of Management shall formulate the terms and conditions of appointment and service of faculty member's officers and employees.

The Registrar shall issue the appointment letters to faculty members, officers and employees in accordance with the policies and procedures as formulated by the Board of Management.

2.1.3.4. Stability of the academic leaders (5) [4]

ICFAI Business School is an employer of choice for its employees. IBS provides fairly long careers to its academic leaders.

As per the ICFAI University norms, the top management officials are appointed for a period of three years. **38%** of the faculty members have been teaching in ICFAI Business School for more than 10 years.

^{3.1.} Attainment of Program Outcomes (50) [42]

The performance of a student in each course is assessed by the faculty by means of continuous evaluation components like, Small Case-lets, Assignments, Seminars, Viva, Quizzes, Projects, Term Papers, Mid-Semester written examination etc. in addition to the End Semester Examinations conducted at the end of the Semester.

Through continual evaluation components the students would be judged for various characteristics such as: Comprehension of concepts, Application of concepts, Creativity and originality, Decision-making ability, Documentation and data handling, Self expression, Leadership and Class participation.

a. Case Discussion and Analysis

The Case Method assists students in identifying typical problems in specific functional areas of management. It is expected that students will study cases, comprehend the business situation, analyze the problems and come up with solutions and then discuss the case in class. A good case is a very powerful instrument in evaluating a student as it puts the student into the shoes of the real-world managers who must face the challenge of decision-making. A case can be evaluated either by asking students to prepare a written report of the case analysis or through discussion of the case in the class. A minimum of 6 cases per course is mandatory. Wherever the Faculty feels that more number of cases would help student in comprehending the subject, the Faculty may increase the number of cases in a course.

b. Quiz

The Quiz is designed to evaluate students in terms of their conceptual understanding and the skills acquired by them during the course of study. It is normally unannounced and is conducted in the first 10-15 minutes of the session. Quizzes are generally conducted in an interactive classroom format seeking active participation by larger number of students and encouraging competitive spirit, mental alertness and initiative.

c. Assignments

Faculty may give home assignments as a component of continual evaluations to be done by students individually or in small groups. These assignments may involve exercises, problem solving, short-notes, term paper, small case-lets with specific questions, conceptual questions etc. These are to be submitted within the time period specified by the faculty.

d. Seminar / Viva

A Seminar/viva is held on the assignment given to the students. The students are expected to defend the work done by them on the assignment. The seminar/viva follows a question-answer session based on the work presented.

e. Mini Project

While undertaking the project, student must take the help of Faculty to define its relevance, rationale, aim and objective, method to be followed and learning outcomes to be achieved. Evaluation of this mini project will be based on achievement of the above mentioned parameters. Students on their own may source this project, if not; they can take help of concerned faculty in getting the same. The project can be dynamic or static (either field based-connected to industry/corporate/institutions or research based using IBS library resources).

f. Mid-Semester Examination

The mid-semester examination will be of 2 hours duration comprising subjective questions testing domain knowledge.

Make up examinations are not conducted for Continual Evaluation components and Mid-Semester Examination.

3.6 Evaluation Feedback

Just as evaluation is carried in a continuous manner, feedback is also available in a continuous and timely manner. The answer scripts, properly evaluated will be shown to the students and clarification, if any, provided by the teaching faculty. Wherever possible, the performance of the students in the evaluation components be discussed in the class giving as much detail as possible like the highest, lowest and average performance.

3.7 Comprehensive Evaluation

The comprehensive evaluation is conducted at the end of the semester covering the entire syllabus.



Learning @ IBS

Management Education at IBS is not just confined to classroom learning. More than anything else, it is about the complete transformation that a student undergoes during the two years. The entire classroom experience, the interaction with faculty and peers both inside and outside the classroom, student activities, leadership training and case studies are all designed to radically change an amateur student's perspective, both personally and professionally, to one wanting to make a real difference wherever he or she goes.

At IBS, learning is all-pervasive and the classroom is an important, but not the only learning Space for the students. The experiential learning inside the classroom is integrated with activities outside the classroom through structured co-curricular and extracurricular activities involving intense student engagement with the help of student clubs. These activities are conceived, led and executed by students, thereby helping them put into practice some of the key concepts that are learned inside and outside the classroom and also develop crucial leadership skills. Student clubs frequently organize campus events touching multiple dimensions of professional and personal life, helping develop a generation of doers and not mere arm-chair managers. The inner circle in the diagram depicts the classroom learning and outer circle represents learning outside the classes.



IBS provides a wide spectrum of learning opportunities to students. The onus of utilizing the resource optimally to enhance knowledge, acquire skills required for employability, rests solely on the students. By the time the program is completed, the student should be able to completely comprehend and analyze the situations and surroundings and formulate appropriate responses expected of successful manager.

Inside Classroom Learning

Core Courses: The academic delivery focuses on enhancing the conceptual and analytical skills in core disciplines. This theoretical framework is designed keeping in view the basic concepts required for a Manager to run business organizations. These courses encompass concepts derived from the disciplines of economics, accounts, finance, human resources, marketing, quantitative methods and business analytics, etc.

Personality Development Courses (Soft Skills): The Soft Skills courses are specially designed to shape the students' personality and enhance their communication, presentational and interpersonal skills. The Soft Skills courses also help the students to prepare for the corporate selection process including group discussions and interviews as well as to be effective in the corporate life.

Cases & Case-lets: The students are consciously oriented to face the real industry scenario. One of the methods employed for simulating real life situation is Cases. Mapping Cases to various modules of the course can transform the students into the mode of the corporate executive engaged in real-life decision making situation. Cases involve analyzing alternatives and choosing the most preferred solution enables the students to develop insights into the complexities

of industry specific attributes, changing nature of competitive markets and emerging structures, and critical success factors determining the final outcome. Also the consumer perspectives in a dynamic setting and changing behavioral insights help students to understand the significance and purpose of various marketing activities.

Electives (Specialization): In the third and fourth semesters, students study integrated management and strategy, in addition to the more advanced courses as electives (students are required to pursue eight elective courses during the program). The program offers students a wide range of electives, broadly categorized into Marketing, Finance, Accounts & Financial Services, Human Resources & General Management, Operations and IT & Systems. A number of electives are available under each category. To specialize in any stream, a student can choose at least four electives from the stream. Thus the balance four electives can be chosen in the following manner.

Four electives from any other stream leading to dual specialization

or

Four electives from any other stream up to minimum of 2 electives from same stream and balance from any other stream.

Guest Lectures: Guest lectures at IBS are part of the academic program. Eminent industry experts visit the campus for sharing their experiences to the students. This adds value to students in acquiring knowledge of latest trends and challenges faced by different industries.

Teaching & Evaluation

The objective of classroom teaching is to awaken the curiosity of students, generate habits of rational thinking in them, sharpen their minds to face the unfamiliar and train them to be able to sustain on their own. While classroom instruction helps the students in the organization and correlation of facts, comprehension of concepts and the creative use of their applications, faculty has the added responsibility to make the students search for knowledge and induce them to use the facilities of the library, computer center and the environment to optimize their learning processes. Self-study by the student would therefore become an important factor in the planning, teaching and evaluation. The student is required to cooperate and gear up to respond to this challenge. Teaching and Evaluation together forms a unity of function and operate in a climate of mutual understanding, trust and respect.

Teaching Methodology

The Teaching Methodology followed by faculty at IBS is an optimal blend of classroom instruction, case discussions and analysis, project work, thesis, seminar, self-study, home assignments etc. Faculty will cover only the key points and not the entire curriculum. Students are expected to prepare for the topics by self-study, as indicated by the faculty. The students are expected to refer to the reference books, articles, papers and websites specified by faculty. This is a constant and continuous effort expected from each student of IBS.

Case Method

A case is a snap shot of a particular event or situation. The case method of teaching requires students to study the case, comprehend the business situation, analyze the problem and come up with alternative solutions. Case Method requires active participation in classroom discussions, written analysis and oral presentations.

The case discussion may be conducted either by forming groups of students or by throwing open the issue to the Class for discussion. The faculty observes the contribution of every member of the group and ensures their equal participation. The students are evaluated on the basis of the following criteria:

- a. Comprehension of the case
- b. Ability to diagnose the problem
- c. Level of participation, initiation and the strength of the argument

Generation of alternatives and their probable consequences

d. Ability to lead the discussion in the right direction and improve its quality

Presentation and communication skills

Faculty Consultation

The faculty will make it convenient to be available in his/her office at a prescribed hour once a

week for each course handled by him/her separately. The day and time of faculty consultations

are announced by the respective faculty in the course handout. During this time students can

approach the faculty for clarification of doubts and difficulties.

The Course Handout

At the beginning of the Semester for each course, a Course Handout is given to the students by

faculty members teaching the particular course. It provides information on pace, coverage, level

of treatment, reading assignments, scheme of evaluation components, course schedule and

consultation hours. Sample of Course Handout is attached.

Evaluation

IBS follows the concept of Continuous Evaluation by the respective faculty members. The

evaluation is evenly spread throughout the semester and the Course Handout indicates when

each evaluation component is scheduled as well as the marks allotted for the component. In the

course handout, the faculty announces his/her evaluation schedule for continual evaluation.

The Faculty plans and conducts the continual evaluations in each course. In order to

make the course more meaningful and bring the students closer to real life situations, several

innovative methods and instruments are used as evaluation components. Through these

components, the students are judged for:

Knowledge of concepts

b. Application of principles

c. Creativity and originality

d. Decision-making ability

e. Documentation and data handling

f. Self expression

Leadership

The Comprehensive Evaluations are held at the end of each semester, through written

examinations.

4.2.2. Quality of continuous assessment and evaluation processes (40) [38]

Continual Evaluation

The performance of a student in each course is assessed by the faculty by means of continuous evaluation components like, Small Case-lets, Assignments, Seminars, Viva, Quizzes, Projects, Term Papers, Mid-Semester written examination etc. in addition to the End Semester Examinations conducted at the end of the Semester.

Through continual evaluation components the students would be judged for various characteristics such as: Comprehension of concepts, Application of concepts, Creativity and originality, Decision-making ability, Documentation and data handling, Self expression, Leadership and Class participation.

a. Case Discussion and Analysis

The Case Method assists students in identifying typical problems in specific functional areas of management. It is expected that students will study cases, comprehend the business situation, analyze the problems and come up with solutions and then discuss the case in class. A good case is a very powerful instrument in evaluating a student as it puts the student into the shoes of the real-world managers who must face the challenge of decision-making. A case can be evaluated either by asking students to prepare a written report of the case analysis or through discussion of the case in the class. A minimum of 6 cases per course is mandatory. Wherever the Faculty feels that more number of cases would help student in comprehending the subject, the Faculty may increase the number of cases in a course.

b. Quiz

The Quiz is designed to evaluate students in terms of their conceptual understanding and the skills acquired by them during the course of study. It is normally unannounced and is conducted in the first 10-15 minutes of the session. Quizzes are generally conducted in an interactive classroom format seeking active participation by larger number of students and encouraging competitive spirit, mental alertness and initiative.

c. Assignments

Faculty may give home assignments as a component of continual evaluations to be done by students individually or in small groups. These assignments may involve exercises, problem solving, short-notes, term paper, small case-lets with specific questions, conceptual questions etc. These are to be submitted within the time period specified by the faculty.

d. Seminar / Viva

A Seminar/viva is held on the assignment given to the students. The students are expected to defend the work done by them on the assignment. The seminar/viva follows a question-answer session based on the work presented.

e. Class room Project

While undertaking the project, student must take the help of Faculty to define its relevance, rationale, aim and objective, method to be followed and learning outcomes to be achieved. Evaluation of this mini project will be based on achievement of the above mentioned parameters. Students on their own may source this project, if not; they can take help of concerned faculty in getting the same. The project can be dynamic or static (either field based-connected to industry/corporate/institutions or research based using IBS library resources).

f. Mid-Semester Examination

The mid-semester examination will be of 2 hours duration comprising subjective questions testing domain knowledge.

Make up examinations are not conducted for Continual Evaluation components and Mid-Semester Examination

Evaluation Feedback

Just as evaluation is carried in a continuous manner, feedback is also available in a continuous and timely manner. The answer scripts, properly evaluated will be shown to the students and clarification, if any, provided by the teaching faculty. Wherever possible, the performance of the students in the evaluation components be discussed in the class giving as much detail as possible like the highest, lowest and average performance.

Comprehensive Evaluation

The comprehensive evaluation is conducted at the end of the semester covering the **entire syllabus**.

The End Semester examination will have three parts. Part A consists of 6 Short Questions. Part B contains subjective questions testing analytical ability, situational analysis and application of principles. Part C comprises Case Analysis.

4.2.3. Quality of student S I P / reports (15) (20) [15]

IBS offers Summer Internship Program (SIP) which forms an important component of education at IBS. It is an attempt to bridge the gap in the student's perception between theory in books and practice in the corporate world. As a part of SIP, students undertake a 14 week internship at any organization/company during the intervening period between close of Semester II and commencement of Semester III.

Every student will be assigned a Faculty Guide at the beginning of the SIP. The role of the Faculty Guide is to enable the student to undertake a meaningful project, provide the necessary academic guidance, and to facilitate evaluation, with the aid of the company executives. The faculty guide would be involved at all stages of the SIP, beginning from 'definition of the work content' to project completion.

Every student works under the counsel of a company guide, who supervises and evaluates the performance of the student at every stage of the SIP and gives feedback to the faculty guide. It is the responsibility of the students to utilize the knowledge and experience of the company guide to complete the SIP.

Quality of the project is measured in terms of:

- Very clear and concise objectives
- Very clear methodology, articulated using technical terms indicating all steps and tools Cites substantial current and good quality literature
- Clarity in research methodology
- Benchmarks used / Assumptions made
- Interpretation of results and justification thereof and validity of the results presented.
- Overall presentation of the report

Outside Classroom Learning

Industry Interface: Summer Internship Program (SIP) is an integral part of the curriculum at IBS with close supervision and guidance from the faculty on continuing basis. The 14 week SIP gives enough scope for the students to learn from practicing managers deeply engaged in decision making and problem solving.

Peer Learning: The case method of teaching requires students to study the case, comprehend the business situation, analyze the problem and come up with alternatives/solutions. Case method requires active learning for which, students discuss and study the case in groups much before they come to the class.

Student Clubs: Student activities are at the core of the philosophy of management education that IBS believes in. The co-curricular and extracurricular activities organized by the student clubs are an integral part of the learning ecosystem that IBS has created. These clubs offer an excellent way to meet new people, develop leadership qualities, deepen specific interests, build character, learn team work and practice management. By participating, connecting and discovering each other in the student clubs, students learn to adjust, compromise, bargain, and negotiate. Student clubs not only plays a critical role in the transformation process but they also make life on IBS campuses enjoyable and memorable. The challenges of a multicultural environment and the complexities thrown up by a competitive environment are turned into opportunities for self-discovery and growth by these clubs.

College Fests: IBS students actively take part in conducting management fests, sports fests and cultural fests in which students from several premier B-schools participate. Such interactions with students from across the country enhances their learning, and help

develop organizational and leadership skills which are highly valued by organizations today:

International Immersion Program: IBS encourages students to visit various countries on international immersion program on self-funding. This provides very useful exposure to the students and helps them in understanding the cross-cultural settings as also developing a world view of how businesses are organized in different parts of the globe.



विशेषकर स्वस्थ कोशिकाओं के खिलाफ लड़कर हमारे शरीर को नष्ट करती है। इसी प्रकार भ्रष्टाचार हमारी अर्थव्यवस्था को भी नष्ट करता है। एक प्रवृत्ति कानून पास कर केवल अंकुश लगाने के लिए प्रभावी होनी चाहिए।वह इसलिए मुश्किल है क्योंकि हमने भ्रष्टाचार को प्रश्रय दिया है। हालांकि 1988 में भ्रष्टाचार निरोधक अधिनियम शुरू किया गया था, लेकिन इससे भी हमें बहुत मदद नहीं मिली है। इसे और सशक्त बनाने और इस अधिनियम के बारे में मध्यम वर्ग और गरीब लोगों को शिक्षित करने की जरूरत है। उन्होंने कहा कि सूचना का अधिकार, जनहित याचिका, सी.आर.पी.सी. और साक्ष्य कानून दंड प्रक्रिया संहिता 1973 आदि के कुशल प्रयोग से भ्रष्टाचार से लड़ने के लिए उनका इस्तेमाल किया जा सकता है।

6.5. Faculty Initiatives on Teaching and Learning (10) [8]

1. Teaching methodology

The main teaching methodology at IBS envisages "individual attention" to students followed by empathy and friendliness. IBS believes in the principles of teaching and transact the curriculum into three parts-Course Planning, Unit Planning and daily Lesson Planning. It automatically results into creation of two segments of learners i.e. good learners and slow learners, steps are taken to improve them further accordingly.

2. Strategy to improve the performance of slow learners.

After identification of their weak domains, we emphasize following steps:

- a) Helping the students to identify their priorities and integrating their efforts to develop the child.
- b) Encouraging them to summarize the concepts/models learned in the classroom.
- c) Encourage and support their' efforts, while also helping them make realistic and appropriate choices; they will develop initiative-independence in planning and undertaking activities.
- **d)** Providing them opportunity to be a leader, involving them with the students who are fast learners.
- e) Breaking the class room into mentor and prodigy.
- **f)** Assessing and analyzing their behavior, their strength and weaknesses, identifying their area of interest and integrating it with the classroom goal.

7.1.4. Participation of Industry professionals in curriculum development, projects, assignments as examiners, in summer projects (10) [10]

Participation of Industry Professionals in summer projects:

Internship Program/ summer projects are a vehicle for introducing students to real-life situation, which cannot be simulated in the classroom and involve active participation of industry professionals in the entire duration of the 14 weeks of the internship. Therefore, internship assignments undertaken by students must necessarily be those of direct interest to the host organization. Students are encouraged to take up time bound multi-disciplinary and goal-oriented assignment involving team work. Solutions to various problems confronted in the assignment might be open-ended, involving an element of analytical thinking, processing and decision-making in the face of insufficient data parameters and uncertain situations.

Internship Program carries a weightage of 18 units, which is normally equivalent to six academic courses. The internship, which would be a simulation of real work environment, requires the students to undergo the rigor of professional environment both in form and substance. It exposes them to technical skills, and helps them to acquire social skills by drawing them into contact with real professionals.

The Faculty Guide in consultation with Company Guide and Campus Committee rates the performance of the student at various stages of evaluation.

The details of evaluation process are described in the following paragraphs.

Evaluation Process

Initial Information Report (IIR)

This report is to be submitted by the student as per the format given at Annexure-I. Student must ensure that all information provided in this report is accurate.

The IIR is not a component of evaluation but it is mandatory and subsequent events are executed on the basis of information provided in IIR. All students must submit copies to Faculty Guide and Company Guide. Initial Information Report is provided in SIS (Student Information System). It is mandatory that every student fills in this form and submits the same to the allocated Faculty Guide and the Company Guide.

Stage I: Internship Proposal Evaluation

The Internship Proposal must cover the following aspects:

i. Synopsis: A statement of about 1000 words describing what the internship is about. (Identifying key issues related to the work assigned and key deliverables)

- ii. Objective: Stating what the internship will accomplish and the value-addition to the organization. (Understanding of the work assigned)
- iii. Limitations of the Study. (Understanding of the work assigned)
- iv. Proposed Methodology. (Action Plan)
- v. Schedule: A time frame indicating steps that will be required and the expected date when they will be completed. (Action Plan)

Copies of Internship Proposal will be submitted by the student as per the format given at Annexure-II to both Faculty Guide and Company Guide.

10.1. Actions taken based on the results of evaluation of each of the POs (20) [18] IBS aims to transform students into leaders of tomorrow's businesses and this development takes place continuously on the IBS campuses. The structure of the Management Program, the corresponding softskills training and the experience of handling events and responsibility brings out the leader in the student.

Case method

The case method puts you in the decision makers' seats and poses the questions. It teaches one to draw insights from pure data and take decisions in the absence of complete data. The person leading the case discussion is a decision maker and the rest of the class will support and push the analysis of the case to the extent possible. The focus is on coming to a decision for the situation in the case with analysis of facts and a 360 degree view.

Soft skills

A leader creates his/her vision for the organization and communicates it effectively to the rest of the organization. The soft-skills training at IBS will enable the students to judge their communication abilities. There is also a focus on improving the EQ of our future leaders so that they are able to deal with the human element of running organizations.

Extracurricular activities

The students are encouraged to participate in a multitude of extracurricular activities so that they come out as well-rounded individuals. Organizing cultural events, talks by stalwarts of the industry and a variety of on-campus activities give the students the chance to manage events, take responsibility for their success and become better, more experienced leaders.

The learning methodology at IBS is based on continuous learning. We are always learning from our surroundings and the events that are taking place around us.

IBS is one of the very few management schools in India to have a 100% case method focus. This method puts the students in the decision-making position and gives their analysis the edge of real-world sensibilities. The case method, made famous by the Harvard Business School, is used world over by leading management institutes. The case method adopts the Socratic way of learning. In this method,

questions are posed one after the other and alternatives are debated over. This kind of learning is not one-to-many as in a lecture but many-to-many with both teachers and students taking the analysis forward.

In the networked world of today, communication skills are becoming very important. A manager's main role is to communicate his/her vision and strategy to others and get them to work with him/her towards that vision. IBS places special importance on the communication and interpersonal skills of the leaders that it sends out into the business world. The students' skills are tested and then fine-tuned through a rigorous yet informal method of learning through doing.

The learning methodology at IBS is drawn from the best in the world, has evolved over the years and is constantly being updated and benchmarked against the best.

The two year MBA Program of IBS is designed to give graduates exposure to management skills needed for the creation of specialists who can integrate across functional areas in a dynamic organization.

10.2. Academic Audit and actions taken there of during the period of Assessment (10) [9]

10.3. Improvement in Placement, Higher Studies and Entrepreneurship (10) [9]

10.4. Improvement in the quality of students admitted to the program (10) [9]

SIP

In addition to the core and specialized courses offered in the program, IBS offers Summer Internship Program (SIP) which forms an important component of education at IBS. It is an attempt to bridge the gap between the professional world and academic institutions. At the end of Semester II, students undergo SIP which is for duration of 14 weeks. SIP is a vehicle for introducing students to real-life situation, which cannot be simulated in the classroom and requires the students to undergo the rigor of professional environment both in form and substance. It exposes them to technical skills and helps them to acquire social skills by drawing them onto contact with real professionals.

Soft Skills

IBS supplements the MBA Program with soft skills which provide a unique opportunity for the student to develop, upgrade their personality, communication and presentation skills.



• One-year PG Diploma and 2-4 week Certificate programs in Cyber Security are being explored with the help of Cyber Security experts.

The Board suggested the following:

- Guidelines for record keeping and classification of published papers, as per requirement for NAAC accreditation, should be circulated to all the faculty members.
- In regard to the window created on the website for innovative ideas of the students, it is necessary to apply a filter so that only healthy ideas are on display.
- In regard to convocation dress, the Committee comprising of VC, PVC and Registrar should decide about the color of waistcoat and angawastram, and take approval of the Chancellor.

42.04 Minutes of the 52th Meeting of the Board of Management of the ICFAI University, Dehradun held on February 02, 2018 at Dehradun

The Minutes of the 52nd Meeting of the BOM were perused and noted.

42.05 Draft Minutes of the 53rd Meeting of the Board of Management of the ICFAI University, Dehradun held on May 04, 2018 at Dehradun.

Draft Minutes of the 53rd Meeting of the BOM were perused and the Board took note of the following:

- Joining of the Pro Vice Chancellor and Chief Admin Officer who is functioning as Registrar (Officiating) as the Registrar resigned and has been relieved during April 2018.
- The highlights in regard to review of operations, such as
 - o Our rankings by external agencies are improving
 - o Our placements are improving
 - o Pay packages of our students are on the rise
 - Our admissions are improving (In 2017, admissions improved by about 40% and in 2018 we are expecting 100% increase over the increased admissions in 2017)
 - The number of students is expected to increase from 1231 in 2017 to about 1800 in 2018.
 - o Conducted many activities including Seminars, Debates, Moot Court, United Nations Model, and UTSAV (that is annual sports and cultural Fest of IUD)
 - Our students participated in many activities conducted by other institutions
 - o In regard to faculty development activity, the faculty
 - Participated in 17 Seminars/FDPs and presented 12 research papers
 - Published 4 research papers including one in an indexed journal and two in Journals with impact factor (4.2 & 5.0)
 - Conducted 26 seminars under weekly seminar series of the University

• In regard to marketing activity, the University Programs are promoted through various initiatives including College Presentations/Seminars, Newspaper advertisements, Advertorial of the Vice Chancellor, Digital Marketing Initiatives, Email and SMS Campaigns, Social Media Channels, and Whatsapp Campaign.

PART B: APPROVALS/REVIEW ITEMS

42.06 New Programs Proposed to be commenced from Academic Year 2018-19

The Board took note of the following proposed new programs from Academic year 2018-19, approved these, in principle, and suggested that CSE companies should be consulted about the utility of the programs and faculty should also be trained on these programs to facilitate interaction of faculty with the students:

- B.Tech. in CSE with specialization in Database Administration and Big Data in collaboration with Oracle Corporation, on Oracle Technology.
- B.Tech. in CSE with specialization in IoT and Web Application Development in collaboration with Oracle Corporation, on Oracle Technology.

42.07 Student Strength and Faculty Profile

The Board took note of the following:

- The University has 1231 students including 48 Ph.D students.
- 18 faculty members are pursuing Ph.D from ICFAI University, Dehradun

The Board suggested the following:

- The faculty members who are not Ph.D and have not registered for Ph.D program should be encouraged to do so. They should be pursued to make presentations in the weekly seminar series of the University on review of literature etc.
- Progress of Ph.D students should be reviewed on regular basis, and corrective measures taken, wherever necessary.

42.08 Ph. D. Program

The Board noted that currently there are 48 Ph.D students comprising of 16 in IBS, 20 in ITS, 9 in ILS and 3 in IEdS. 8 of these are pursuing their course work, 31 are working on their thesis proposals and 9 are in the process of completing their research work to write their thesis. During the last three months, 5 students defended their thesis proposals and 2 gave seminars on their thesis progress.

42.09 Research Publications

The Board appreciated the efforts by the faculty in publication of Papers in International and National Journals. However it was brought out that there is a need for more publications.

42.10 Seminars/Conferences Conducted/Attended

The Board appreciated participation of the Faculty in 17 Seminars and presentation of 12 research papers, in addition to conducting 26 seminars under the weekly seminar series of the University.

42.11 FDPs/Workshops Conducted/Attended

The Board noted that the faculty conducted 5 workshops and attended one international training program at Bangkok, Thailand.

42.12 Student Activities

There has been a marked increase in student participation in various co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. The Board appreciated the same.

42.13 Marketing Activity for the Year 2018-19

National Head Marketing explained the Board that our team having 8 Marketing Offices in the states of Uttarakhand, UP & NCR is working for admissions at IUD. The University Programs are promoted through various initiatives including College Presentations/Seminars, Newspaper advertisements, Advertorial of the Vice Chancellor, Digital Marketing Initiatives, Email and SMS Campaigns, Social Media Channels, and WhatsApp Campaign

It was brought out by the Board members that the projected figures have been reduced in comparison to those presented in the last meeting of the BOG. This reduction in target figure is not a healthy sign, and the team should ensure minimum of 700 admissions.

The Board suggested that various other activities should be undertaken by the University to improve awareness about the university and admissions, such as:

- Writing articles in news papers
- Extensive use of social media
- Conducting Principals Meets
- Conducting Marketing Fests and Science Exhibitions
- Conducting workshops in schools in rural/tribal areas
- More guest sessions by Judges to share their experience
- More guest lectures by industry experts
- Interaction of select BOG members with the students
- Greater involvement of alumni
- Foreign/Industry/Institutional collaborations
- Establishing contact with ICSSR for inviting international students.

42.14 Budget for the Year 2018-19

The Annual Budget (Revenue and Capital Expenditure) of Rs.63.54 Crore for the year 2018-19 was approved. The Board was informed that the deficit of Rs.30.44 Crore arising due to capital expenditure/campus development would be met through Bank Loans.

42.15 Constitution of the Selection Committee for Appointment of the Registrar

In view of the resignation of the Registrar, as per the provisions of the Act and the First Statues of the University, the Selection Committee shall be constituted for the appointment of the Registrar as under:

In terms of Section 17(1) of the Act read with Section 1.4.1 and 1.4.2 of the First Statutes, the Registrar shall be appointed by the Chancellor, based on the recommendation of the Selection Committee appointed for the purpose.

As per Section 1.4.2 of the First Statutes, the Selection Committee shall consist of the following members:

- i) One representative of the Chancellor
- ii) One representative of the Sponsor who is also a member of the Board of Governors
- iii) One expert nominated by the Board of Management, who is not in any way connected with the University.

The Board was informed that the Chancellor has nominated Dr. Ajay Pathak, Vice-Chancellor of the ICFAI University, Tripura University on the Selection Committee.

The Board was also informed that the Board of Management has nominated Dr. Y R Haragopal Reddy, Former Vice Chancellor, Acharya Nagarjuna University on the Selection Committee.

The Registrar (Officiating) was advised to write letter to the Sponsor requesting for the name of its nominee for constituting the Selection Committee and arrange for convening of the meeting of the Committee at the earliest.

PART C: INFORMATION ITEMS

42.16 Joining/Resignation of Senior Officials

The Board welcomed Dr. Muddu Vinay who has joined IUD as Dean IBS and Pro-Vice Chancellor, and Brig. Sethi (Retd.) who has joined as Chief Administrative Officer and is functioning as Registrar (Officiating). Also, the Board took note of the resignation and relieving of the Registrar (Col. (Retd) A K Dutta).

42.17 Rankings of the University

The Board appreciated the latest good rankings of the University, and specifically took note of the following:

- ICFAI Law School being ranked 1st in Uttarakhand with rating of AAA by Careers 360, Survey 2018, and ranked 2nd in Uttarakhand by CSR-GHRDC Law School Survey 2018.
- ICFAI Tech School being rated AAA+ by Careers 360 Survey 2018.

42.18 Awards and Achievements

The Board appreciated the achievements of the faculty, and specifically took note of the following:

- A faculty member has been awarded Outstanding Academic Leadership Award.
- Three faculty members were invited as resource persons for the programs conducted by other institutions.
- A humble beginning of IUD in the area of providing management consultancy services to the corporate.

42.19 Campus Project

The Board was briefed on the various civil engineering works being undertaken and hiring of a local architect to design & supervise all future projects of IUD, including:

- Construction of Hostels, Academic Block, Additional Class Rooms on the existing structure, and Staff Quarters.
- Repair and renovation of all existing Labs of ITS that will be completed shortly.
- Water accumulation in basement and plinth protection work that will be completed shortly.
- Repair and painting work (External and Internal) that will commence shortly.

42.20 Preparation for NAAC Accreditation

The Board was briefed about the work in progress based on the new parameters of assessment for NAAC accreditation. The Pro Vice Chancellor, who has good experience in accreditation processes, assured that the University would submit Self Study Report (SSR) by end December 2018, for NAAC accreditation.

42.21 Convocation 2018

The Board was informed that Convocation 2018 of the ICFAI University, Dehradun is scheduled to be held on July 14, 2018. Hon'ble Vice President of India Mr. M Venkaiah Naidu has kindly given his consent to grace the Occasion as Chief Guest. Governor of Uttarakhand will preside over the function. Chief Minister and Minister of Higher Education (independent charge) of Uttarakhand will be the Guests of Honor.

IUD has constituted 15 committees for the smooth conduct of Convocation.

The Board approved the proposed convocation dress. The Board members were of the view that the Chancellor and Deans need to have distinct Angavastram and the same has been finalized.

It was also felt that very fine quality Angavastram be catered for the dignitaries with a distinct color. The same is being finalized and shall be complied with.

42.22 IUD in Media

The Board appreciated the good visibility of the University events in media.

42.23 Compliance Report

Compliance Report of The ICFAI University, Dehradun for the period ending April 30, 2018 was received and noted.

42.24 Any other item with the Permission of the Chair


42.25 Date for the next meeting

The Board observed/offered the following in regard to the above points:

- In regard to item 54.04, Prof. AVN Rao offered to review the curriculum of Certificate in Cyber Security.
- In regard to item 54.04 relating to one year Post Graduate Diploma Programs, it was expressed that such programs will compete with one-year LL.M programs and as such may not be successful.
- In regard to item 54.05, it is proposed that a comprehensive Project proposal should be prepared by involving an external expert as IUD does have an internal expert in this area, for taking any decision in regard to introduction of B.Sc. (Agriculture). As of date, 12 institutions in Dehradun are offering this program.

PART B: APPROVALS / REVIEW ITEMS

55.04 Student Strength and Measures to Improve Enrollment

In regard to student strength and measures to improve enrollment, the Board observed the following:

- The enrollment has increased in the recent period from 291 in 2016 to 451 in 2017 and to 557 in 2018, implying an increase in enrollment of 160 in 2017 and 106 in 2018.
- The student strength has been on the rise in the recent period. It has grown from 1044 in 2016 to 1231 in 2017 and to 1557 in 2018, indicating an increase of about 48% over the last two years.
- At the micro level there are certain major concerns, which need to be addressed.
 - o One major concern is less strength of students in ITS and IEdS.
 - The other major concern is inadequate visibility of new programs, requiring special focus on advertisements and exposure to such programs in the University presentations.
- The University has taken steps to create positive vibes at the campus with a view to influence enrollment, such as
 - o Revamping of cafeteria that has been turned into a hub centre of students
 - Another coffee outlet in opening soon to cater for demand of baked goods and coffee etc.
 - Various clubs such as Cultural Club, College to Corporate Club, Photography Club, Sports & Trekking Club, Yoga & Meditation Club, and Social Responsibility Club have been activated to facilitate complete personality development and social life for the students.
- Various measures have been taken to improve visibility of the University, such as

- IUD face book page has been created that is actively managed by the Media Manager Mr. Aasteek Thapliyal.
- The University hoardings have been displayed on all the University and University-hostel buses.
- The practice of putting University stickers on the vehicles of staff/students entering the University campus has commenced.
- Staff/students are given monetary award for writing positive blogs about life at the campus.
- o It has been decided to facilitate enhanced participation of students in competitions and social events conducted by other institutions.
- To enhance effectiveness of presentations in Schools/Coaching Centers, it has been decided to constitute teams comprising of students, faculty and placement managers to make the presentations.

55.05 Faculty Profile

The Board noted that there is need for appointing senior faculty. For ILS, advertisement has already appeared in the Ascent on September 12, 2018 and interviews are scheduled on September 24, 2018. University is hoping to get some good candidates.

55.06 Review of Operations

In reference to the review of operations of each of the four Schools of the University, the Board noted the following:

- Placements as well as pay packages have significantly improved. Also, some of the premier companies have participated in the recruitment process.
- Rankings by external rating agencies have improved with ICFAI Law School being ranked as 1st or 2nd in Uttarakhand by different agencies.
- During the last two months, the faculty published 5 research papers, 15 faculty members participated in conferences and presented 11 research papers, and conducted 5 seminars/workshops at the University.
- Some of the faculty members represented India in the events conducted abroad or were invited to conduct Ph.D thesis viva-voce.
- Some of the faculty members/students received awards for academic excellence including monetary award upto Rs. One lakh.

55.07 Approval of Annual Accounts and Annual Report for the year 2017-18

The Annual Accounts for the year 2017-18 together with the Audit Report were reviewed and recommended for submission to the Board of Governors for approval. Annual Report on the activities of the University for the year 2017-18 was reviewed and recommended for submission to the Board of Governors for approval.

55.08 Appointment of Statutory Auditors for the year 2018-19

A proposal to reappoint M/s. Narasimha Rao & Associates, Chartered Accountants as Statutory Auditors for the year 2018-19 on a remuneration of Rs.50,000 plus GST and

reimbursement of out of pocket expenses was reviewed and recommended for submission to the Board of Governors for approval.

55.09 Marketing Activities and Measures to Improve Enrollments

The Board reviewed the admissions as on September 07, 2018 that turned out to be 419 as against the target of 675, implying requirement for review of campus environment and marketing strategies. The Board observed the following:

- The faculty provided full support to the marketing team.
- Maintaining University brand is important. Therefore, only the programs which strategically suit the University should be pursued.
- There should be some minimum number of students in a class to retain synergy to learn from each other.
- Inputs of marketing officials could be useful in evolving strategies to boost the recently launched new programs.
- As about 23% of the aspirants who paid admission fee did not register for the programs, there is need to conduct exit interviews to the extent feasible to have an understanding of the reasons for the same. This would help evolve strategies to improve conversion of admissions to registrations.
- The conversion of sale of applications to admissions is low (less than 11%) that requires pruning of quality of applications.
- The contribution of News paper advertisements and FM/TV activities has been meager, leaving significant scope for improvement in enrollments through effective use of these sources. Some of the strategies which could be useful in this regard include:
 - More effective presentations at the Career Launcher Centers and Schools involving a combination of students, placement officers and faculty for making presentations about IUD.
 - o Increase in visibility at the education fairs and a generous distribution of 4-8 page brochures about the IUD to the aspirants.
 - o Adequate presence in the local/national news papers.
 - o Arranging adequate publicity of the events of the University in Media.
 - o Improving visibility at the websites and social media.
- The marketing activities must commence from first week of October 2018 because of students in the Schools are available for interaction only upto end of December.
- The marketing team should visit IUD during last week of September 2018 for briefing, motivational talk and sharpening their marketing skills.

55. 10 Discipline Proceedings

As per Para 11 of IUD Notification Act 2003, the Board approved reconstitution of the Disciplinary Committee for enforcing discipline in the University with the following composition, for tenure of one year:

55.11 New Program

In regard to the recently launched new programs and proposed new programs, the Board observed the following:

- Fee structure of all the recently launched programs, not attracting good number of admissions, should be reviewed in comparison to the fee structure of competing institutions. Upward revision of fee structure of these programs may be avoided and higher scholarships may be considered to be more competitive in comparison to other competing institutions.
- There should be adequate publicity given to the newly launched programs.
- Fee structure of the Certificate program in Cyber Security should be decided and the program should be launched within 2018-19.
- Regarding the proposed new program, B.Sc. (Agriculture), a comprehensive project proposal should be prepared as discussed earlier to facilitate a decision.
- In regard AICTE promoted Bachelor of Vocation programs, the experience in institutions in Gujarat is not good. One or two of these programs may be chosen based on rigorous market survey.
- In regard to Diploma/Certificate programs in IPRs, Human Rights and Environmental Laws, initially the program in an area may be launched for a focused attention, and programs in other areas may be launched at a later date based on the experience gained.

PART C: INFORMATION ITEMS

55.12 Status of Ph.D. Students

The Board noted that currently there are 63 Ph.D. students on rolls (including 16 admitted in the year 2018), comprising of 23 in IBS, 23 in ITS, 14 in ILS and 3 in IEdS. Out of these, 19 are pursuing their course work, 30 are working on their thesis proposal, and 14 have already defended their thesis proposals and are working on their thesis. To submit PhD Thesis a candidate is required to publish two papers in refereed journals.

55.13 Campus Projects

In regard to campus projects, the Board noted the following:

- Received CLU of the remaining 10.89 acres of land and the design has been proposed by the Architect for construction of drain and Bridge at the cavity.
- Master Plan for 10.89 acres of land has been prepared and suited by the Architect. It is to be reviewed and approved by the Sponsor. Master Plan includes New Academic Building for ICFAI Law School, Girls Hostel (G+7 Building), Boys Hostel (G+7 Building) and other insularly buildings.

- It is proposed to construct one more floor above existing building to meet the requirement of class rooms.
- Repair and Renovation of TECH Labs completed 90%.
- The water accumulation in Basement and the Plinth Protection work completed 90%.
- Repair and Painting work of the whole IUD campus is being carried out. About 70% of the work has been completed. It is observed that, in some areas, the Paint and Workmanship quality is compromised by the company and steps are being taken to rectify the situation.
- Extension of the Height of the Southern Boundary wall by 12 feet is completed.

55.14 Preparation for NBA and NAAC Accreditation

The Pro VC explained the Board that,

- In regard to preparedness for accreditation by NBA, Internal Audit-1 and Internal Audit-2 have been completed, improvements have been suggested and implementation is in progress. External audit is scheduled to be conducted in October 2018 before filing the application for accreditation.
- In regard to preparedness for NAAC accreditation, the status is as follows:
 - First Internal Audit has been completed, and modifications are being made on the basis of suggestions received
 - Student Satisfactory Survey has been prepared and floated among the students, till date 100 responses have been received.
 - o Prof. R P Kaushik may be invited in Nov. 2018 to review the status and advise.

55.15 Convocation 2018

A short video of about 10 minutes on the Convocation 2018 was shown to the Board members. The same was appreciated by the members and the invitees.

55.16 IUD in Media

Presented, pursued and noted. The Board appreciated good publicity of IUD events in media.

55.17 Compliance Report for the Period Ending August 31, 2018

Received and noted.

55.18 Any other item with the Permission of the Chair

The Board suggested the following:

- Each Dean/In-charge of a School should prepare a strategy plan for enhancing enrollment.
- There is need to analyze why we are lacking in admissions, in spite of having good academic infrastructure.

• Activity plan may be included in the Agenda for information. This should help also in accreditation process.

55.19 Date for next meeting

It was agreed that the date of the next meeting will be fixed in consultation with the Vice Chancellor.

The chairman welcomed the Academic Council (AC) members and invitees, and presided over the meeting.

Agenda and Resolution:

44.01 Grant of leave of absence, if any

Prof. (Dr.) DPS Verma, Prof (Dr.) Devashish Ghosh and Prof. (Dr.) B K Joshi could not attend the meeting and they were granted leave of absence.

The Council noted that Prof (Dr.) Devashish Ghosh and Prof. (Dr.) B K Joshi failed to attend many of the AC meetings. In such a situation, possibility of substituting them by other members should be explored.

44.02 Confirmation of Minutes of the 43rd Meeting of Academic Council of The ICFAI University, Dehradun

Minutes of the 43rd Meeting of Academic Council were presented and confirmed.

44.03 Follow-up Action on the Minutes of the 43rd Meeting of AC

The Council noted the following follow-up action:

- Ph.D scholars have been advised to submit the Ph.D. Thesis in Shodhganga Format so that these can be easily uploaded on Shodhganga.
- Modifications in Ph.D rules and regulations have been adopted.
- The category of backlog students has been clarified.
- The decision that a student must secure minimum 30% marks in both Comprehensive examination and Grand total to pass a course has been implemented.

- Choice of Japanese language has been introduced in BBA.LL.B (H) and BA LL.B
 (H) programs. The possibility of offering foreign language in other programs shall be explored.
- Syllabus of B.Ed. program has been updated.
- Attempts are being made to have more number of Senior Faculty.
- Attempts are being made to sign an MOU with Oracle Corporation for conducting B.Tech in CSE with specialization in Big Data and Database Administration in collaboration with **Oracle Corporation.**
- The feasibility of introducing B.Sc (Agriculture) Program and its commercial viability is being explored. The Committee comprising Dr Vishal Gupta, Dr. Anurag Areon and Prof. Satendra Kumar has been set up to examine the issue.

44.04 Minutes of the 5th Meeting of Board of Examination (BOE)

The Minutes of the 5th meeting of BOE were presented and the Council approved the following major recommendations:

- To implement policy of moderation of question papers from Comprehensive Examination December 2018.
- If a student has already met the attendance criterion for appearing in the comprehensive exam then he/she will not be required to attend classes to re-appear in the comprehensive examination for grade improvement or for any other reason. The student can take exam by self study. In this case, his/her internal marks (Weightage 20%) obtained in the first registration will remain unchanged. Student will not be required to appear in Mid-Term Examination and he/she will be evaluated fresh for 80% Weightage of marks in Comprehensive Examination.
- There should be external re-evaluation. The student would be required to pay a fee, per answer script, along with written application for re-evaluation, as may be prescribed by the competent authority. No change of marks will take place if the increase in marks is less than 10%.
- In case, a student appears for End-Term exam for improvement of grade, better of the previous and current grades will be retained.
- Examination manual should be printed in a booklet form, and also uploaded at the IUD website.
- Academic regulation should be reviewed in light of IFHE and IBS regulations.
- Logo of IUD should not be given in the Examination Question Papers. Only ICFAI watermark should be used in Examination question paper.

The Council suggested that Examination manual should be finalized and uploaded on the website of IUD.

44.05 Student Strength and Select Measures to Improve Enrolment

Council noted the student strength and the measures to improve enrolments, and suggested that all the measures should be aggressively pursued to influence enrolments.

44.06 Faculty Profile

The Council observed that there is need to recruit Senior faculty in all the Schools. Accordingly, efforts should be made to recruit Senior faculty as soon as possible.

44.07 Preparedness for NBA accreditation

The Council noted that pre-qualifier has already been approved by NBA, and SAR is likely to be submitted by mid January 2019. The council appreciated the contribution of faculty and staff in preparation for accreditation by NBA.

44.08 Preparedness for NAAC accreditation

The Council noted that External audit was conducted during November 26-27, 2018 by Prof. R P Kaushk and Prof. R P Mohanty, and the University has been advised to proceed for NAAC accreditation. The council appreciated the contribution of faculty and staff in preparation NAAC accreditation.

The Pro VC, informed the Council that Pre-qualifier is scheduled to be submitted to the NAAC by end January 2019, and SSR by end March 2019.

44.09 Approval for Awarding the Degrees to Graduating Students

The Council approved the lists of 22 regular students (15 B. Tech and 07 BBA-LLB (H)) and 739 distance mode students (739 MBA) for award of these degrees.

44.10 Recent Rankings awarded to IUD

The following recent rankings awarded to IUD by external agencies were noted and appreciated.

- The ICFAI Business School is ranked 1st in Uttarakhand by CSR-GHRDC Survey 2018 & Ranked 7th in North Zone by Silicon India Survey 2018.
- o The ICFAI Law School is ranked 1st in India by India Today and Careers 360 surveys 2018, and Ranked 2nd in Uttarakhand & 7th among the Top Law Schools of Eminence by CSR-GHRDC Survey 2018.
- The ICFAI Tech School is ranked 1st in Uttarakhand by India Today and NPTEL Surveys 2018, and Ranked 1st in Outstanding Category at All India Level by CSR-GHRDC Survey 2018.

44.11 Student Activities

The Council noted the various student activities conducted by all the Schools including guest lectures, workshops, competitions (Essay Writing, Debates), expempore, industrial visits, yoga sessions, meditation sessions, tree plantation, and social service activities (Say No to Drugs, Celebrations with differently able persons), and appreciated.

The council suggested that more number of eminent persons may be invited as guests of honour during the events such as National Moot Court event, and Model United Nations.

44.12 Research and Publications

The Council noted that the faculty published 9 research papers including two in books and 4 in indexed journals and one in a journal with impact factor (1.73). Also, the Council suggested that the faculty members should be motivated to write more research papers which should be published in indexed journals of repute.

44.13 Seminars/Workshops conducted at IUD

The Council noted that the University conducted 24 Seminars/Workshops including a National level event (ICFAI Model United Nations) that witnessed participation of more than 200 students representing 24 institutions spread across the States.

44.14 Papers presented in Seminars/Conferences outside IUD

The Council noted that the faculty participated in 24 conferences/Seminars and presented 17 research papers.

44.15 Status of Ph.D. Scholars

The Council noted that out of the 60 registered Ph.D students 22 are pursuing their course work, 25 are preparing to defend their thesis proposals, 11 have already defended their thesis proposals, and 2 are on the verge of defending their thesis. One of the Ph.D students published one research paper.

44.16 Analysis of result

The council took note of the analysis of results of the class of 2018 students as given below

- Percentage of passed out students is 97.1, 98.1 for UG students and 95.0 for PG students.
- 7.3% students received CGPA above 9.

44.17 Faculty & Students Achievements

Faculty and students achievements were noted and appreciated.

44.18 Proposed New Programs

The Council noted the proposed B.Tech and Integrated B.Ed programs. Additionally, a Committee has been constituted with Pro VC as the Chairperson and Deans/Incharges of Schools as members, to explore the possibility of introducing B.A. (Journalism/Political Science/Psychology).

44.19 Transfer of one Ph.D. student from Chandigarh University.

The Council suggested that transfer of Ph.D. students may be permitted subject to mapping of course work. Any paper of the Ph.D course work at the IUD that the student has not studied, if any, has to be studied by the student at the IUD.

44.20 Any other matter with the permission of the chair.

- Curriculum of BBA program should be reviewed and ambiguity regarding project be clarified.
- The possibility of introducing Value Addition Programs, beyond curriculum, should be explored by all the Schools.
- The council suggests that cyber security certification program be introduced with effect from even Semester commencing January 2019. IUD students may be required to pay a nominal Registration fee of Rs.1000/-.
- The Council advised to explore the possibility of introducing certificate program in Energy Audit Program. For this purpose, a two member Committee headed by Dr Sandip Vijay and Dr Vishal Gupta as member is constituted.

- It was brought to the notice of the Council that for effective use of the facility of SWAYAM/MOOC courses for which credit facility can be availed, requires establishment of some infrastructure (AV equipment, Dish, Projector, TV and VOIP: Voice over Internet Protocol) for which maintenance could be available from UGC. The Council suggested that the required infrastructure should be created and credit transfer facility be formalized through BOS. SWAYAM/MOOC programs may be offered as electives.
- The Council noted that there is a nominal Registration fee for the online programs of SWAYAM/MOOC, and suggested that such Registration fee may be paid by the University as these courses are being offered as electives in the curriculum.
- Also, the Council suggested that the offer of online FDPs through SWAYAM should be availed to the benefit of faculty.
- The Council constituted a two-member Committee comprising of Dr. Sandip Vijay and Mr. Amit Das to suggest measures to deal with the above issues relating to SWAYAM/MOOC programs.
- The Council suggests that ICFAI Law School should explore the possibility of introducing the Certificate programs in International Law, Business Law and IPR.
- It was brought to the kind notice of the Council that 3D Printers are useful in designing in Engineering. Pro VC showed to the Council members a sample of 3D printing. Accordingly, the Council constituted a three member Committee headed by Pro Vice Chancellor and Dr Sandip Vijay, Mr Amit Das as members to examine the utility of 3D printer for IUD and submit its report by Feb. 10, 2019. Also, the Council suggested that an online lecture session on 3D printing technology should be organized.

44.21 Next Meeting of the Council

Next meeting of the Council will be fixed in consultation with the Chairman.

Item 56.10 Campus Project

(Senior Civil Engineer to brief)

- The sponsor had procured 25 acres of land for the University. 14.11 acre of land is already used for academic building and Admin offices. For the balance of 10.89 acre land, CLU has been recently obtained. As this piece of land is separated from the already constructed piece of land by a cavity, it is proposed to construct a drain and bridge over the cavity. The architect has given the design for the same and work order has been issued to the contractor in August 2018. The contractor has applied for approval from District Magistrate for using JCB inside IUD Campus. After getting permission to use JCB, the bushes will be clean and area will be marked according to the proposed construction plan for hostels and other buildings.
- The University is planning to use the above piece of land for constructing Girls Hostel and Boys Hostel G+7 Building, Academic Block for ICFAI Law School (G+10 Building), Vice Chancellor's Bungalow and other Insularly buildings. An Architecture has been associated with the project for technical support.
- It is proposed to construct one more floor above the existing building to meet the class room requirement in the future as explained below. The request for the same is being considered by the Management.
- Work relating to Repair and Renovation of TECH Labs has been completed.
- Repair and Painting work of the whole IUD campus has been completed.
- Work relating to extensions of the Height of the Southern Boundary wall by 12 feet, to cover the shabby view of the adjacent building outside, has been completed.
- The water accumulation in Basement and the Plinth Protection work completed excepting water proofing of a channel that is pending due to rainy season, the same will be completed by end January 2019.







44.04 Minutes of 5th **Meeting of BOE** (Brief by In-charge COE, Dr. Rakesh Pandey)

5th meeting of Board of Examination (BOE) was held on October 24, 2018 at VC Board Room. The minutes of the meeting are placed as Annexure 44.04. The major recommendations of the BOE are:

- To implement policy of moderation of question papers from upcoming Comprehensive Examination December 2018.
- If a student has already met the attendance criterion for appearing in the comprehensive exam then he/she will not be required to attend classes to re-appear in the comprehensive examination for grade improvement or for any other reason. The student can take exam by self study. In this case, his internal marks (Weightage 20%) obtained in the first registration will remain unchanged. Student will not be required to appear in Mid-Term Examination and he/she will be evaluated fresh for 80% Weightage of marks in Comprehensive Examination.
- There should be external re-evaluation. The student would be required to pay a fee, per answer scripts, along with written application for re-evaluation, as may be prescribed by the competent authority. No change of marks will take place if the increase in marks is less than 10%.
- In case, a student appears for End-Term exam for improvement of grade, better of the previous and current grades will be retained.
- Examination manual should be printed in a booklet form, and also uploaded at the IUD website.
- Academic regulation should be reviewed in light of IFHE and IBS regulations.
- Logo of IUD should not be given in the Examination Question Papers. Only ICFAI watermark should be used in Examination question paper.






