#### Veganism: Call for A Better World

Since the earliest civilizations, man is known to use animals as a way of survival. We have been using them for food, clothing, agriculture and what not! Human has extracted every possible benefit from them without giving them anything in return. He has been treating them as a means of survival rather than a fellow living being who equally deserves to live its life freely just like humans.

According to data published by Global Animal Slaughter Statistics and Charts, based on the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of United Nations, more than 70 billion land animals are killed worldwide for food every year by animal agriculture industry.

PETA, a global organization that work for the welfare of animals and protecting animal rights, states that more than 31 million ducks are killed each year for their flesh cruelly. More fish are killed for food every year than all other animals combined, as tens of billions of fish and shellfish are slaughtered annually.

According to PETA, on the "factory farms", animals endure mutilations like debeaking, dehorning and castration without painkillers. They are packed in as tightly as possible to maximize output and profit, resulting in their death from disease or infection. Animals raised for food are crowded into trucks and transport through all weather extremes and then at the slaughterhouse, the throats of those who survived the transport are slit, often while they are still conscious. Many remain alert when they are plunged into the scalding-hot water of the defeathering or hair removal tanks.

Then their bodies are torn apart and their corpses are presented to humans to fill their belly. Most animals slaughtered for food are practically babies, who are broken apart from the sides of their mothers and the nourishment that the mothers long to provide their offspring is instead shipped off for human consumption.

This brutality doesn't end here. Its not only their meat for which they are subjected to cruelty, but also their skin, milk, wool and teeth. Animals exploited for food, cosmetics, clothing, entertainment are, at no point, given the status of an individual, in deriving milk, wool or meat of an animal, we objectify them. We forget that animals are not SOMETHING, they are SOMEONE.

These inhumane practices that the animals are exposed to are executed for the fun and comfort of humans and for satisfying their so-called needs. People show affection towards animals and love them on one hand and still choose to wear leather and contribute to their harm on the other hand. What right do we have on their lives for us to subject them to such cruelty? Are humans the only living beings who deserve to live? Aren't we being too selfish to end someone else's life just to extract benefits for ourselves? If we will ask

ourselves these questions, we will realize what wrong are we doing and how

selfish we have been to these poor beings.

The idea of veganism is not against drinking milk or eating milk products, rather it is against the violence the animals are subjected to for obtaining milk and other benefits from them.



Nourishing ourselves at the cost of someone else's life and then feeding upon their corpses, is this the humanity of humans? And that too when it is not even necessary? We can live a decent and even better life without harming them, then why don't do so. It is a proven fact that a vegan diet is far more beneficial for our health than an animal-based diet. The Academy of Nutrition and Diet notes that eating plant-based food reduce the risk of suffering from many chronic degenerative diseases and conditions, including heart diseases, cancer, hypertension, diabetes and obesity. Whether you go vegan for the animals, the environment or your health, you have the power to change the world, simply by changing what's on your diet. Its high time we should realize that humans are not the only beings living on this planet nor they are the most superior. Animals should be given equal treatment and equal consideration. That is the only way we can save humanity and empathy present inside us.

Even though there is a lot more open conversation, it is in a celebratory sense of the community, especially in mainstream spaces. Corporates will run Diversity and Inclusion initiatives to hire from the community without any understanding of who the community actually is. There should also be more sensitization which will happen with more conversations.

Mass change in courts- Discrimination is still there but there is a social acceptance of sexual orientation and gender identity rights. Because of the strong judgement, people do have to accept that gender identity or sexual orientation may be different but the Constitution protects it.







So, one level there is an openness in talking about these issues and a positive response by people. Second, we see that there has been a mass change in the courts. After September 2018, we have got positive judgements from different courts on trans rights. It is going to take a long time for many other things to happen but it has already started.

REMAINING WORK GOES BEYOND LEGAL a lot needs to be done at the socio-cultural level. The judgement has limitedly helped transgender people and those targeted by the police, but familial and social acceptance is still a pipe dream for many. They are still being forced into heterosexual marriages or are ostracized. the remaining work goes beyond just the legal and has to percolate into the social and cultural. There remains a universe of socio-legal benefits available to heterosexual cisgender people that is out of reach for the rest. In terms of legal rights, beggary and medical laws, provisions around gender identity and medical welfare are the elephant in the room. One must look at family law: inheritance, adoption, and parental rights. Marriage and divorce are some other domains that queer people have no scope to authentically access.

There have been a lot of changes. The biggest being that queer people are a little more confident about themselves. There are a lot of people who have been able to find courage and come out post the judgement and even argue their case in front of their parents and peers. BUT A LOT OF MILES LEFT TO COVER. "Openness may not completely disarm prejudice, but it's a good place to start." — Jason Collins

Special marriage act puts in danger by anti conversion law of several states

There were several states in the past especially with large tribal populations have passed law against religious conversions, In 1967,odisha was the first state to pass law against religious conversion –The Freedom of Religion Act, which was similar followed by Madhya Pradesh in 1968 also Arunachal Pradesh enacted in 1978.Tamilnadu passed The Tamil Nadu Prohibition Of Forcible Conversion Act, Primarily focused on Christian machinery but the era of MODI led government A new generation of anti conversion laws.

Both Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh added the word Marriage to their acts. Uttarakhand Freedom of Religion Act and Himachal Freedom of Religion Act said that even if conversion is done for marriage then it must be notified. In Uttarakhand, the law empowered the parents and siblings of the individual being converted with the right to go and complain to the district magistrate if they feel that conversion is taking place without following the regular process.

The law passed in Uttar Pradesh notes that forceful conversion is a cognizable and Non-Bailable offence. The punishments are much higher than earlier six months to three-year jail and fine of 10,000 Rupees. These laws were targeted the basic feature of special marriage act, the original special marriage act was enacted in 1872. It was moved by a popular jurist and legislative council member named Henery Maine also the campaign started by Keshab Chandra Sen follower of Brahmo Samaj. There was one problem with this new constituted law that two people of different faiths/religion who want to marry each other, both of them give up their own religion/faith, but this sacrifice is not compatible in this era of liberalism so the special marriage act 1954 replaced this 1872 act. I think that if any couple wants to marry each other that depends on their own thinking (no matter they belong to which religion, caste etc.) no one has right to interfere with their thinking.

These laws not only interfere their rights but also the basic idea of special marriage act .it made to validate and register interreligious and inter-caste marriages in India.

The criminalization of interfaith marriages in the name of forced conversions, couples are being forced to choose between the devil and the deep blue sea. This twin monitoring from the law and the extreme right performing its intended task of discouraging interfaith marriages and maintaining religious (purity). These new laws are now complicating the lives of young people who have decided to choose their own partners. The attitude of the law is reflected in the name of the act itself –something that is out of the ordinary and deserves constant security.

#### **Regulation of Artificial Intelligence**

Artificial intelligence is one in every of the new topics within the current scenario especially since the continued of pandemic we've got surrounded ourselves with the AI related products from smart phones to smart speakers, but the advancement of AI also needs some laws for governing it, number of the countries currently have laws to manipulate it unfortunately India doesn't have any specific laws referring to the AI. Artificial intelligence is vital for India because it is predicted to contribute \$15.7 trillion to the world economy by 2030, And as we know Indian government is ambitious in making India one amongst the most important economy within the world it's important for us to be involved in the race of AI. As we stand on the brink of the technical revolution and AI is alleged to play a significant role within the coming events its high time that we realize its importance and also get involved with the AI. Other countries have already started making rapid progress in the field of AI and India must also not lag behind and start

focusing on AI based innovation and start establishing AI ready infrastructure and prepare its citizens for the revolution.

The framework for regulating AI and its application by the government of India is in its initial stages and there is much to do in the field of AI by the government. The steps taken by the government for creating an AI friendly eco system in India are the following: In 2017, the ministry of commerce and industry set up an AI taskforce which highlighted various sectors of importance for AI regime and the challenges of adopting AI in India. In 2018, NITI Aayog, was directed to initiate the programs on AI and its application.

The ministry of Electronics & Information Technology constituted four committees to develop a policy frame work and analyses issues like leveraging AI, Key policy enablers required across various sectors, and legal and ethical issues to AI. In January 2020, NITI Aayog recommended that an AI explicit computer framework 'AIRAWAT' be set up to satisfy the processing needs of the innovation hubs, startups, AI researchers and students.

It is to be noted that the development done by the government In AI is primarily in collaboration with the private corporations for example NITI Aayog collaborated with the IBM to develop precision agriculture using AI for doubling farmers income by 2020. the government of Andhra Pradesh used Microsoft's machine learning platform for monitoring children and devote student-focused attention on identifying and curbing school drop-outs.





Accountability is essential to the continuous development of AI and its application. it follows that it is hardly possible to think about the application of AI without any legal restrictions. With the rapid advancement in the field of AI and its applications that covers almost every aspects of our life, but with this the owner of the AI is also needed to be aware to have an ownership of the AI and to protect lives related to such AI applications. The use of AI applications has been increased with the advancement of the machine learning and the AI application are used for generating intellectual property based on 'intelligence'. This gives rise to the need of the intellectual property rights in the AI application. thus, there arises a need for a review of the existing laws to keep up with the advancement in the field of the AI. India presently does not have any specific legislation that covers data protection or privacy. In the matters relating to the data protection or privacy the supreme court of India gives judgement using the 'the right to privacy'. Currently NITI Aayog is in the process of launching a program to develop a national repository and curated pathology images. The policy also talks about having a decentralized data market place that is based

on blockchain technology which will attract data providers and model builders to build AI applications. Considering that the advancement in the AI at a global level, India must seek to enhance its participation in various AI projects in co-ordination with international bodies. a good example is the WHO working closely with the ministry of health and family welfare, Government of India to provide technical support for AI initiatives pursuant to the government's commitment to end tuberculosis by 2025.

#### The Last Colour (Film Review)

Khanna, in his novel, writes, "How could they? Their ears were hardened to the likes of her. What is the significance, after all, of a life struggling to be born in a city where people come to die?"

Set in the late 1980s, in the ghats of Varanasi, India, 'The Last Color' is a screen adaptation of Indian- American Michelin Star Chef Vikas Khanna's novel of the same name, directed and produced by himself, starring Neena Gupta and the child artist Aqsa Siddique as protagonists.

Both of them yarn to play with colors but are held back by taboos. With a running time of ninety minutes taking the Indian audience by storm, breaking conventional rules and traditions, it is a mixture of emotions. A film with a difference, the narration revolves around a widow bound by dogmatic traditions; a transgender who is unable to come home to a family and an orphan who is untouched by higher castes. It also throws light on biased police atrocities and how the want for a son is prevalent in numerous Indian families even today. "In the city of colors, she was a colorless woman".

The Last Color' describes the story in a series of flashback focusing on how a 9-year-old tightrope walker 'Choti' strikes an unusual but beautiful friendship with a transgender 'Anarkali' and the widow 'Noor'. The way both characters develop their friendship by exchanging little moments, from being strangers to having a platonic love for each other, will warm your hearts. Noor is supposed to live a harsh and simple life, wearing a plain, white saree at all times. She loves to play with colors, to dance and carried a red book with her at all times. Noor learns how to read and write only for the little girl. "*Meri Choti. Mera Chaand.*"

Choti asks Noor, "Why do you always wear a white saree?" To this, Noor replies by saying, "After the death of our husbands, our lives become colorless." Choti sells flowers to collect a sum of RS. 300 to go to school and is helped by her beloved friend 'Chintu'. As she lay in a room on her charpai, listening to the rain pouring, Noor emotionally recalls Choti saying that the puppy started to cry as she pat him maybe because he wasn't accustomed to love and how someone, for the first time, expressed care for her by bringing tea in a small handi. Most of the scenes have a subtle quietness in them contrasting with Noor's way of life. The following day, Noor whispers to Choti, "These people call you an untouchable! One day, fly so high that they will never be able to touch you". "My grandfather brought me to the riverbank for the first time. That morning, it suddenly became dark! A small moon eclipsed such a big sun! The sun wins every day. But the moon has it's day too!"

The film is exquisitely crafted, unfolding a new era of hope and freedom. Right from floating of the diyas on water to the scene where the Supreme Court of India passes a historic verdict and the widows enjoy the festival of Holi, in its full eminence, seems surreal. The soft music and background blend perfectly as the scenes change. At times, Choti makes the audience break into laughter using her wit and sarcasm with her mischievous yet innocent eyes! She was a fearless girl in the city of Gods. "Can I call you Ma?"

The second half of the film unfolds the world's reality. A loving woman tries to protect and free a child from the clutches of a barbaric society whilst the transgender is abhorred for committing the crime of being a human. Choti runs to see her one last time wearing a rose-colored dress sown by Noor on the day of Holi and covers Noor in her favourite color of pink while walking on a rope from above. Despite Choti's wish, she never got to introduce Noor and Anarkali to each other.

The role of Rudrani Chettri who is a transwoman is worth mentioning. Other actors including Rajeswar Khanna, Aslam Shekh and Neha Khanna have also done full justice to their roles. However, wish we got to see a bit more of them. Some of the questions remain unanswered and some characters could have been better woven into the main story. Overall, I would give the film a 4.2 out of 5. Twenty-four years lapse and we are brought back to the present day. When the widows celebrate their freedom on the festival of colors, it will make you want to play Holi with them. At last, color became a symbol of victory, freedom and rebirth, marking the end of a dark era. The fine human emotions and Neena's acting makes you connect to her in such a way that you even feel like a part of her life towards the end. It makes you realize that eventually we are all humans, breathing the same air. A must watch; this film will stay with you forever filling your hearts with ecstasy and shades of pink!

## **INDIRA GANDHI**



The only daughter of Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru, Indira Gandhi was destined for politics. First appointed prime minister in 1966, she garnered widespread public support for agricultural improvements that led to India's self-sufficiency in food grain production as well as for her success in the Pakistan war, which resulted in the creation of Bangladesh in 1971. After serving three terms, Gandhi was voted out of the office for her increasingly authoritarian policies, including a 21-month state of emergency in which Indians' constitutional rights were restricted. In 1980, however, she was re-elected to a fourth term. Following a deadly confrontation at the Sikh's holiest temple in Punjab four years later, Gandhi was assassinated by two of her bodyguards on October 31, 1984, ushering her son Rajiv into power and igniting extensive anti- Sikh riots.

## An Untouchable Tale Dr. B. R. Ambedkar's life was filled with hardships.



Before India's independence, caste discrimination and untouchability were practiced in Hindu society. There were many who suffered because of this. One of those who suffered was Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar, who later went on to become the Father of the Indian Constitution.

During his childhood, Bhimrao was travelling by train with his elder brother to meet his father, Ramji Sakpal. The two brothers got off at a small station called Masur in Maharashtra.

Their father lived far away from the station, so Bhimrao and his brother decided to hire a hand-pulled rickshaw, which was common during those days.

The rickshaw-puller made them sit in his rickshaw and started pulling it. He chatted with the two boys and after some distance, asked, "Children, what is your caste?"

"We are Mahars," said the boys. The rickshaw-puller was very angry and gave the rickshaw a violent jerk and both the boys fell off.

The rickshaw-puller began shouting at the boys. "How dare you sit in my rickshaw! You have now polluted my rickshaw!"

A crowd gathered there and more people came as news spread that two Mahar children had sat in the rickshaw and made it unholy for the upper caste.



"What can you expect from such low-caste children?" said someone.

"These untouchables have not only polluted the rickshaw, they have ruined the poor man's day," said someone else.

Bhimrao and his brother did not know what to do. No one took their side. All they were told again and again was that being born in a lower caste was a sin.

They began getting scared, when the rickshaw-puller began abusing them. After a long time, the crowd moved away and the boys were left alone.

They had no choice now, but to walk to their father's house. It was hot and dusty. As they walked, the boys began to feel thirsty and tired. But nobody offered them water.



They could not drink water from a well or from the lake as in those days, lower castes were not allowed to touch wells or lakes.

People thought even their touch would pollute the water bodies. So, unless someone poured water for them to drink, the boys had to remain without water.

But since they were so thirsty, Bhimrao forgot all about his caste, drew water from a well and started drinking it.

But before he could drink enough, he heard someone screaming.

The well belonged to the high castes and someone from that caste had seen them drinking water from the well. The bucket and the well both had now become dirty. Soon, a crowd gathered because of the shouting.

Bhimrao felt he was surrounded by a pack of wolves ready to pounce and eat them up. The crowd then started discussing how they could recover the cost of the damage done by the boys. And also they wanted to punish the children for them the crime that was so severe that there was no possible money that the two brothers could give.

The people began beating the boys. Nobody stopped to think that these were two thirsty children. All that they had done was drank some water, which was a gift of nature. But to the crowd, the boys were low caste and deserved to be beaten. Some in the crowd began saying that beating the boys was not enough. They had to be punished even more severely.



They decided to shave the boys heads and some people ran to look for a barber. But in those days, it was difficult to find a barber who would shave the head of a lower caste person!

None of the barbers in Masur agreed to shave the boys' heads.

The barbers were scared that no one would come to them if they knew that they had touched a lower caste boy.

The two brothers were beaten up badly, and finally managed to escape the angry crowd. This incident affected Bhimrao deeply. He started thinking about ways to remove the caste system from Indian society.

He realised that education was the only way to free himself and others like him from such horrible injustice.

Bhimrao became a scholar. He became a doctor in 1927 from Columbia University in New York City for his thesis 'National Dividend of India—A Historic and Analytical Study'. In 1923, he did further education in Economics from London School of Economics.

Bhimrao Ambedkar not only drafted the Constitution of India, but he was also India's first Law Minister. To make people aware about how badly lower castes were treated in India, he took part in several revolutions, wrote many books, and edited newspapers.

It was on the principal of equality and friendship, he wanted a new India to emerge from the British rule.



Unfortunately even today, lower caste Indians do not get treated equally. In upper caste houses, they are not allowed to sit on chairs, have to eat from a different plate and they still get badly treated in many other ways as if they are lesser.

सुनते हैं कि आज के बच्चे आत्मकेंद्रित होते जा रहे हैं। वे परिवार को जानना नहीं चाहते। हो सकता है, लेकिन हम उन्हें परिवार से, अपनों से जोड़ने के लिए कहानियाँ भी कहाँ सुनाते हैं! हम उन्हें दूर के रिश्ते के उन दादा जी के बारे में कहाँ बताते हैं, जिन्हें शादियों में मंडप बाँधने का शौक था, जो शहर के हर परिचित अपरिचित के यहाँ शादी का मंडप बाँधने पहुँच जाते थे, जिन्होंने इस काम के लिए अपने चेले तैयार कर लिए थे ताकि उनके बाद भी यह प्रथा चलती रहे। हम उस बल्लू के बारे में कहाँ बताते हैं, जो किसी भी घर में मौत की खबर सुनते ही अपने आप बिना बुलाये अर्थी बाँधने पहुँच जाता था और जिसे मंज़ूर न था कि एक गाँठ भी गलत लग जाए। हम कहाँ बताते हैं कि गाँव में कोई भी पर्व-त्यौहार होने पर आँगन और सड़क को सजाने के लिए रंगीन कागज़ की झंडियाँ बनायी जाती थीं। गाँव में उत्सव किसी के यहाँ भी हो अनाज का पिसान सबके यहाँ होता था। दही हर घर में जमाया जाता था। शाक-भाजी आढ़त से नहीं लाई जाती थी बल्कि घर-घर से उसका संग्रह किया जाता था। मिठाइयों की तश्वरियाँ हुआ करती थीं और उन तश्वरियों को खाने की प्रतियोगिताएँ चलती थीं। सुख्खू कुबड़ा सौ रसगुल्ले खा जाता था। वो चहलपहल, धूमधाम, रसिकता, रंग, आमोद-प्रमोद! हम कहाँ बताते ै हैं उन्हें यह सब? उस पर तुर्रा यह कि शिकायत भी करते हैं कि आज के बच्चे इकलखोर होते जा रहे हैं|

हम परेशान रहते हैं कि बच्चे टीवी से चिपके रहते है| परेशान तो रहते है, लेकिन यह नहीं बताते कि टीवी का आना हमारे बचपन में एक सामाजिक घटना थी| रविवार की शाम जब दूरदर्शन पर पिक्चर आती थी तो सारा मौहल्ला टीवी के सामने इकट्ठा हो जाता था| दरियाँ बिछाईं जाती थीं, चाय बनती थी, गाना आने पर बच्चे नृत्य करने के लिए खड़े हो जाया करते थे, टीवी को रंगीन बनाने के लिए उसके सामने रंगीन स्क्रीन लगाई जाती थी और पूरा मौहल्ला एकाग्रचित्त होकर एक परिवार बनकर आनंद लेता था| मूंगफली के छिलके तोड़ने की आवाज़ लगातार आती रहती थी| बूढ़े काका वैजयंती माला को स्क्रीन पर देखकर भावविभोर हो जाया करते थे| किसी ने बताया कि नेहरू जी वैजयंती माला के बड़े प्रशंसक थे| सुनकर काका, जो स्वयं नेहरू जी के अनन्य भक्त थे, नेहरू जी के प्रति शंकित हो जाते थे| उनके चेहरे पर अनायास ही ईर्ष्या का भाव जाग उठता था| दोनों एक ही भावभूमि पर स्थापित हो जाया करते थे| कृषि-दर्शन का कार्यक्रम पूरे चाव के साथ देखा जाता था| पूरा समाज मासूमियत की डोर से बंधा था|

जो काम हज़ारों-लाखों वैज्ञानिक नहीं कर नहीं कर सकते, यादें आपस में मिल-मिला कर एक यंत्र बनाती हैं, जिसे टाइम-मशीन या समय -यंत्र कहते हैं। आज उस समय-यंत्र की सबने सवारी की और घूम आये दशकों पीछे की दुनिया में जब बिनाका गीत माला बजा करती थी, हॉकी के टैस्ट मैच होते थे जिनका आँखों देखा हाल सुना जाता था, शास्त्री जी रेडियो पर देश में अन्न की कमी की बात करते थे तो उनकी एक पुकार पर लाखों लोग सप्ताह में एक दिन उपवास करना आरम्भ कर देते थे, प्रेशर कुकर को स्वाद का हत्यारा कहा जाता था, गैस पर खाना पकाने में गृहणियाँ डरती थीं, आधा हिन्दुस्तान रात में लालटेन और तेल की ढिबरियाँ जलाता था, भाप के इंजन से चलने वाली रेलगाड़ियों की सवारी की जाती थी और कभी-कभार अखबार में कम्प्यूटर नामक खोज के बारे में छपता था जिसके बारे में सुना जाता था कि वह इंसान की इच्छा से भी तेज़ दौड़ जाता है। आग के नीचे रेत में कुछ शकरकंदियाँ दबा दी थीं। उनके भुनने की गंध फैलने लगी थी।

किसी ने मज़ाक में पूछा कि पेंसिल और कैसेट का क्या सम्बन्ध है| लगभग सभी बड़ों को ध्यान था कि कैसेट लपेटने के लिए उसमें पेंसिल घुमाई जाती थी| याद आया कि कैसेट ख़राब होने पर कूड़े के ढेर पर फेंक दी जाती थी और शरारती बच्चे उसे खोल कर फीता कुत्ते की पूँछ में बाँध देते थे| हवा में लहराता हुआ फीता गली के एक सिरे से दूसरे सिरे तक पहुँच जाता था| अब बच्चे स्कूल जाते हैं| ट्यूशन जाते हैं| होमवर्क करते हैं| बचे हुए समय में विडियो गेम खेलते हैं या बड़े शहरों की सोसाइटियों में बने पार्कों में झूला झूलते हैं| अब हम उन्हें गली में खेलने ही नहीं देते|

एक दोस्त की पत्नी ने बड़ी हसरत से याद दिलाया जब गली की औरतें दोपहरियों में काम निपटाकर साथ बैठती थीं। पापड़ बेलती थीं, कचरियाँ तोड़ती थीं, जवे उतारती थीं, फंदे गिनते हुए सलाइयाँ चलाती थीं और पास में खेलते किसी के भी बच्चे को भी बुलाकर नाप का अंदाजा लेती थीं, छोटी छोटी लड़कियों को क्रोशिया चलाना सिखाती थीं, फ्रेम में कपड़ा कस कर फूलों और बेलबूटों की कढ़ाई करती थीं या झुण्ड में बैठी सबसे बूढ़ी औरत से जानकारी लेती थीं कि बीस किलो आम के अचार में कितनी कलौंजी और बितना तेल डालना चाहिए। आग के चारों तरफ वे ही बूढ़ी, जवान जानकार औरतें बैठी दिखाई देने लगीं जिनके संचित ज्ञान का हस्तांतरण पीढ़ी दर पीढ़ी मौहल्ले के किसी घर के दालान में ऐसे ही होता आया है। जो पहले कलाएँ थी, अब झंझट हो गए हैं। अब तो सब बाज़ार में मिल जाता है। सच है, सारा सामान बाज़ार में मिल जाता है लेकिन भावनाएँ अभी भी किसी दुकान पर नहीं मिलतीं।

भागती-दौड़ती ज़िंदगी में रिश्ते-नाते जमते से जा रहे हैं| मिलना नहीं होता किसी से भी| सिर्फ मिलने के लिए घंटों सफ़र करके लोग किसी दोस्त-रिश्तेदार के घर नहीं जाते| बतकहियाँ नहीं होती| कहकहे नहीं होते| किस्सों की बेरोकटोक धाराएँ नहीं बहतीं| बेलाग बातें नहीं होती| धौल-धप्पा नहीं होता| फ़िज़ूल की गप्पें नहीं होतीं| कुछ ठंडे से दो-चार लफ्ज़ इधर से और कुछ जमे से दो-चार फ़िक़रे उधर से और बात ख़त्म| फिर काम की बात पर आ जाते हैं| कितनी काम की होती हैं, इसका किसी को कोई अंदाजा नहीं| माना जाता है, काम की बातें होती हैं| हर दिल डरा सा रहता है कि कहीं किसी को कोई बात बुरी न लग जाए| फ़िक्र रहती है कि अगर किसी ने कोई तीखी बात कह दी तो उसका जवाब क्या होगा| हम बातों को मज़ाक में उड़ाना भूल रहे हैं|

आज माहौल कुछ बदला सा लगा। घंटों तक लकड़ियाँ दहकती रहीं, अग्नि की जीभ लपलपाती रही, परछाइयाँ अँधेरे में नाचती रहीं और फिर धीरे धीरे आग ठंडी पड़ने लगी। लकड़ियाँ कोयले में और कोयला राख में बदलने लगा। धीरे धीरे सब उठे, चलने का उपक्रम हुआ, विदा ली गयी, नमस्कार-प्रणाम-बाय-गुडनाइट का दौर चला और सब अपने अपने घर की ओर रुखसत हुए। सर्दी बहुत थी, कोहरा और ठिठुरन भी, लेकिन आज कोई काँप नहीं रहा था। सब अच्छी तरह तपे हुए थे। खासतौर पर बच्चों के गाल तो मारे गर्मी के बिल्कुल सुर्ख हो गए थे।
