- Ph.D scholars have been advised to submit the Ph.D. Thesis in Shodhganga Format so that these can be easily uploaded on Shodhganga.
- Modifications in Ph.D rules and regulations have been adopted.
- The category of backlog students has been clarified.
- The decision that a student must secure minimum 30% marks in both Comprehensive examination and Grand total to pass a course has been implemented.
- Choice of Japanese language has been introduced in BBA.LL.B (H) and BA LL.B (H) programs. The possibility of offering foreign language in other programs shall be explored.
- Syllabus of B.Ed. program has been updated.
- Attempts are being made to have more number of Senior Faculty.
- Attempts are being made to sign an MOU with Oracle Corporation for conducting B.Tech in CSE with specialization in Big Data and Database Administration in collaboration with **Oracle Corporation**.
- The possibility of introducing B.Sc (AG) Program is being explored.

44.04 Minutes of 5th Meeting of BOE (Brief by In-charge COE, Dr. Rakesh Pandey)

5th meeting of Board of Examination (BOE) was held on October 24, 2018 at VC Board Room. The minutes of the meeting are placed as Annexure 44.04. The major recommendations of the BOE are:

- To implement policy of moderation of question papers from upcoming Comprehensive Examination December 2018.
- If a student has already met the attendance criterion for appearing in the comprehensive exam then he/she will not be required to attend classes to re-appear in the comprehensive examination for grade improvement or for any other reason. The student can take exam by self study. In this case, his internal marks (Weightage 20%) obtained in the first registration will remain unchanged. Student will not be required to appear in Mid-Term Examination and he/she will be evaluated fresh for 80% Weightage of marks in Comprehensive Examination.
- There should be external re-evaluation. The student would be required to pay a fee, per answer scripts, along with written application for re-evaluation, as may be prescribed by the competent authority. No change of marks will take place if the increase in marks is less than 10%.
- In case, a student appears for End-Term exam for improvement of grade, better of the previous and current grades will be retained.
- Examination manual should be printed in a booklet form, and also uploaded at the IUD website.
- Academic regulation should be reviewed in light of IFHE and IBS regulations.
- Logo of IUD should not be given in the Examination Question Papers. Only ICFAI watermark should be used in Examination question paper.

- The enrolments increased by 160 in 2017 and 106 in 2018, implying an increase of about 91% over the last two years.
- The student strength increased by 187 students in 2017 and 326 students in 2018, implying an increase of about 49% over the last two years.
- At the micro level, there are certain major concerns, which need to be addressed.
 - One major concern is less strength of students in ICFAI Tech School and IEdS.
 - The other major concern is inadequate visibility of new programs, requiring special focus on advertisements and exposure to such programs in the University presentations.

II. Measures to Enhance Enrolment

A. Steps Taken to Generate a Feeling of Active Social Life at the Campus

The steps taken to create positive vibes at the campus with a view to influence enrolment include:

Cafeteria: Cafeteria has been revamped and with the active support of the Caterer, a number of improvements have been made such as a TV screen, music system, variety of snacks, shakes and ice-creams. It has already become a hub centre of students.

- Another coffee outlet has been opened to cater to demand for baked goods etc.

Clubs: A number of clubs have been started with a wide participation of students. These clubs are being shouldered by young Faculty volunteers.
